TRADE SECRET LITIGATION: CHINA'S COURTS GETTING TOUGH

Trade secrets have always been challenging to enforce in China's courts. Our data shows both fewer cases overall, and lower win rates in comparison to other types of IP. However, following amendments to the law in 2019, and Supreme People's Court guidance in 2020, the courts now have more muscle to apply, including significantly higher damages and reversal of the burden of proof onto the defendant, a vital measure to uncover if, and to what extent, secrets were misappropriated.
